Multimedia Installation- Performance at Grace this Weekend

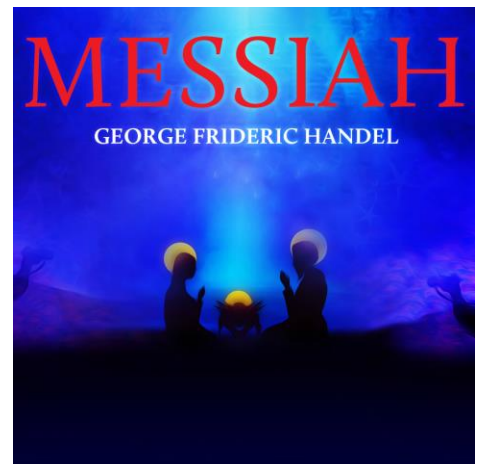
Friday-Sunday, December 1, 2, & 3
