The Open Doors Ministry at Grace Church

DID YOU KNOW? Here is some interesting information about one of our most vibrant ministries which does not occur on Sundays! The Open Doors program at Grace Church allows free public access to our beautiful sanctuary weekdays between the hours of 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. Regularly-scheduled docents are on hand each day to provide a friendly welcome and information for visitors entering through the front doors off Westminster Street. The reasons people come inside are as varied as the individuals themselves: some to warm up during cold weather or to cool off (at least a little!) on sweltering days; others to light candles at the votive station or sit for a few minutes in prayer. Visitors from out-of-town see the sign on the sidewalk and come in to learn about the history of our parish and its architecturally-stunning



home. During 2023, Open Doors welcomed 3,469 visitors (that were recorded – probably several hundred more on special Saturdays, such as RIPride, PVDFest, etc), representing at least 30 states (plus the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico) and 21 countries outside our own. The story of Grace and the warmth of its members stretches from our North American neighbors, through Central and South America, across Africa and Eurasia, all the way to New Zealand (and Westerly...).

Blessed Chalk Available at Church

This past Wednesday, Fr. Jonathan blessed sticks of white chalk during the Noonday Eucharist as per our annual tradition during Epiphanytide. It has been a tradition in the Church to bless chalk at the masses for Epiphany, and then use the blessed chalk as part of blessing one's home in the New Year. Above the doorways of the home, the chalk is used to write 2024 for the year and C, M, B for the three Magi (Casper, Melchior, and Balthazar) which also functions as an acronym for the Latin phrase "Christus Mansionem Benedicat", which translates as "May Christ Bless this House". During this Epiphany season, we hope you take part in this house blessing, and we wish all a blessed, healthy, and safe New Year!
