

Pledging Update

This fall, I invited you all to join me in increasing your pledge to Grace Church by 10%. I'm pleased to say that pledging increased by more than double that! For stewardship 2023 (pledges made last year for the calendar year 2023), we had 117 pledges for a total amount pledged of \$321,520. So far this year we have a total of 113 pledges for \$397,343. Pledges historically continue to arrive into the new year, so we'll likely match last year's number of pledgers. And, of course, the total amount pledged is already significantly higher than last year and will continue to grow, too.



If you haven't yet made a pledge for next year, you could be the one to help us exceed last year's number of pledgers, so don't let the success of this year's campaign give you the impression that your pledge isn't needed!

Thank you to everyone who helped make this year's stewardship campaign such a success!

Special Service for Epiphany


