As we approach our 200th Anniversary as a parish (in 2029) it is exciting to think about restoring our pipe organ and beautiful mural, complete with an angel orchestra! Lent IV is 'Rose' Sunday!

This coming Sunday, we observe The Fourth Sunday in Lent, also known as "Laetare" or "Rose" Sunday. The word "Laetare" means "Rejoice!" and comes from the Introit sometimes sung at the beginning of the liturgy on Lent IV. This Sunday marks the half-way point during the season of Lent is sometimes also known as "Refreshment Sunday" during which the more penitential ethos of the season was relax a little bit with pink/



rose-coloured vestments, allowing roses and other flowers on the Altar, and the baking and eating of Simnel cakes (a rich, fruit-cake popular in medieval England). In England, Lent IV is also sometimes to referred to as "Mothering Sunday" and is observed in a similar way as "Mothers' Day" here in the US.

Here at Grace Church, we are blessed with a beautiful set of rose-coloured vestments made for us by parishioner and Altar Guild member Sue Hall in 2021 and dedicated to all past and present members of the Altar Guild. As always, you're most welcome to come up to the High Altar following the service and check out Sue's handiwork!

If you feel moved to do so, consider wearing some pink or rose colors when you come to church on Sunday, just like when we wear red on Pentecost!

Summary: The American Choral Directors' Association Conference at Grace Church

From February 28 to March 2, Grace Church was the primary performance space for the American Choral Director's Association Eastern Region Conference. Over 500 singers representing 25 choirs from around the region rehearsed and performed in our beautiful church. A highlight was on Thursday evening when VOCES8, a premier professional ensemble from England, performed for a capacity crowd of over 800 people! It was thrilling to see the church so full of people



who love music! Many attendees remarked on the beauty of the space, and how welcome they felt while here. It was a special joy to welcome **Grace's own choir alum Sarah Hughes**, who was here with her choir from the University of Delaware, where she is a music education major. It was an honor and privilege to host all the choirs and their directors here at Grace Church.

Refugee Bins at Grace Church

In recent years people at Grace Church have contributed more than two dozen bins of supplies to help greet and settle newly arrived refugees in our community. Now some of those bins are empty, needing to be "adopted" (and filled) for a new set of new arrivals. We have about a dozen bins which we are handing out along with a list of desired items for different rooms (e.g. kitchen, child's room, single adult, etc). Or, you can provide your own bin! Since this is a wonderful way to translate a Lenten spiritual discipline into a physical act of love for our (new) neighbors, please pick up a list/bin on Sunday, choose a room, and **return it** (filled) in two weeks by March 17th, so we can be ready for Holy Week the following week! Thursday Lenten Eucharists

Join us next **Thursday, March 14 at 6:00 PM** for a short Eucharist service with music, prayers, and a brief reflection on specific pieces of Christian artwork offered by lay parishioners of Grace Church. 
