Spotlight: A Reflection on the Solar Eclipse

My family and I travelled to Stowe, Vermont on Monday to witness the total solar eclipse. Having just experienced the glorious Easter celebration at Grace Church the week prior, I offer this brief reflection on what the eclipse may have in common with the worship we offer to God in church each week.

A word often used by people who've witnessed a total eclipse is "awe." There is something about experiencing a total eclipse that defies explanation and brings up the simplest of all prayers, which writer Anne Lamott calls a prayer of "wow!" Having now seen a total solar eclipse with my own eyes, it felt to me akin to what it was like on Easter Sunday when hundreds of us sang together "Jesus Christ is Risen Today" or the final "Hallelujah" of the "Hallelujah Chorus." Just, "wow!"

One can have a transcendent experience of God alone on a mountaintop, of course, which, I'm sure, is how some witnessed the eclipse on Monday. But I experienced it with my family and hundreds of other people in a snowy field. At the moment when the moon completely obscured the sun, a great cheer went up from all of us. None of us planned to cheer. It was just a visceral expression of what we felt as a community of wonder-ers who were joined together by nothing more than the joy of being a part of this rare celestial event. Similarly, at our Easter worship last Sunday, no one in that gathering knew all 435 of us by name. As the church's rector, I might have come closest, but, at best I knew the names of half of the people gathered together on that sacred day. Many of us strangers to one another, we were brought together not because we were family or friends but because we wanted to share with others this joyous and wondrous celebration.

Lastly, the eclipse connected us with those throughout history (and before!) who have looked up at the skies and had the same experience of wonder and awe. New Englanders witnessing this great event said the same thing this week that they did centuries ago – "Wow!". As we celebrate each November during our All Saints' and All Souls' worship services, we are a community not just of the 435 people gathered at the corner of Westminster and Mathewson Streets on Easter Sunday but of all those who have done so before we were even born, for almost 200 years.

It will be many decades before a full solar eclipse returns to New England, but we share in the wonder of God's creation at Grace every Sunday in our own way. For that, we share another one of the one-word prayers to God identified by Anne Lamott – "Thanks!"

BROWN UNIVERSITY


THURSDAY, APRIL 18th at 12:00 NOON
