





THE PRESENTATION

The Bishop and People sit.

A Priest and a Lay Person, and additional presenters if present, standing before the Bishop, present the Ordinand, saying,

Nicholas, Bishop in the Church of God, on behalf of the clergy and people of the Diocese of Rhode Island, we present to you Jeffrey Charles Drake Douglas to be ordained a priest in Christ's holy catholic Church.

Bishop Has he been selected in accordance with the canons of this Church? And do you

believe his manner of life to be suitable to the exercise of this ministry?

Presenters We certify to you that he has satisfied the requirements of the canons,

and we believe him to be qualified for this order.

The Bishop says to the Ordinand,

Will you be loyal to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of Christ as this Church has received them? And will you, in accordance with the canons of this Church, obey your bishop and other ministers who may have authority over you and your work?

The Ordinand responds,

I am willing and ready to do so; and I solemnly declare that I do believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly engage to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of The Episcopal Church.

Please stand as you are able.

The Bishop says to the people

EAR FRIENDS IN CHRIST, you know the importance of this ministry, and the weight of your responsibility in presenting Drake for ordination to the sacred order of priests. Therefore, if any of you know any impediment or crime because of which we should not proceed, come forward now, and make it known.

Bishop Is it your will that Drake be ordained a priest?



THE OLD TESTAMENT READING

Isaiah 6:1-8

Reader A reading from the Prophet Isaiah.

N THE YEAR THAT KING UZZIAH DIED, I saw the LORD sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said: 'Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory.' The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: 'Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!' Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: 'Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out.' Then I heard the voice of the LORD saying, 'Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I; send me!'

Deacon The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

AM THE GOOD SHEPHERD. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away — and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.

THE SERMON

THE NICENE CREED

WE BELIEVE IN ONE GOD, the Father, the Almighty,

maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,

the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father.

Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven:

by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.

He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE EXAMINATION

All are seated except the Ordinand, who stands before the Bishop.

The Bishop addresses the Ordinand as follows

Y BROTHER, THE CHURCH IS THE FAMILY OF GOD, the body of Christ, and the temple of the Holy Spirit. All baptized people are called to make Christ known as Savior and Lord, and to share in the renewing of his world. Now you are called to work as a pastor, priest, and teacher, together with your bishop and fellow presbyters, and to take your share in the councils of the Church.

S A PRIEST, IT WILL BE YOUR TASK to proclaim by word and deed the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and to fashion your life in accordance with its precepts. You are to love and serve the people among whom you work, caring alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor. You are to preach, to declare God's forgiveness to penitent sinners, to pronounce God's blessing, to share in the administration of Holy Baptism and in the celebration of the mysteries of Christ's Body and Blood, and to perform the other ministrations entrusted to you.

In all that you do, you are to nourish Christ's people from the riches of his grace, and strengthen them to glorify God in this life and in the life to come.

Bishop My brother, do you believe that you are truly called by God and his Church to this priesthood?

Drake I believe I am so called.

Bishop Do you now, in the presence of the Church, commit yourself to this trust and responsibility?

Drake I do.

Bishop Will you respect and be guided by the pastoral direction and leadership of your bishop?

Drake I will.

Bishop Will you be diligent in the reading and study of the Holy Scriptures, and in seeking the knowledge of such things as may make you a stronger and more able minister of Christ?

Drake I will.

Bishop Will you endeavor so to minister the Word of God and the sacraments of the New Covenant, that the reconciling love of Christ may be known and received?

Drake I will.

Bishop Will you undertake to be a faithful pastor to all whom you are called to serve, laboring together with them and with your fellow ministers to build up the family of God?

Drake I will.

Bishop Will you do your best to pattern your life and that of your family in accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to your people?

Drake I will.

Bishop Will you persevere in prayer, both in public and in private, asking God's grace, both for yourself and for others, offering all your labors to God, through the mediation of Jesus Christ, and in the sanctification of the Holy Spirit?

Drake I will.

Bishop May the Lord, who has given you the will to do these things, give you the grace and power to perform them.

Drake Amen.




All now stand except the Ordinand, who kneels facing the Bishop, and the presbyters who stand to the right and left of the Bishop

A period of silent prayer follows, the people still standing.

The Bishop then says the Prayer of Consecration.

OD AND FATHER OF ALL, we praise you for your infinite love in calling us to be a holy people in the kingdom of your Son Jesus our Lord, who is the image of your eternal and invisible glory, the firstborn among many brethren, and the head of the Church. We thank you that by his death he has overcome death, and, having ascended into heaven, has poured his gifts abundantly upon your people, making some apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry and the building up of his body.

Here the Bishop lays hands upon the head of the Ordinand, the Priests who are present also laying on their hands. At the same time the Bishop prays,

Therefore, Father, through Jesus Christ your Son, give your Holy Spirit to Drake; fill him with your grace and power, and make him a priest in your Church.

The Bishop continues,

AY HE EXALT YOU, O LORD, in the midst of your people; offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to you; boldly proclaim the gospel of Salvation; and rightly administer the sacraments of the New Covenant. Make him a faithful pastor, a patient teacher, and a wise councilor. Grant that in all things he may serve without reproach, so that your people may be strengthened and your Name glorified in all the world. All this we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever.

The People in a loud voice respond: Amen.

The newly ordained Priest is now vested in a stole and chasuble, according to the Sacred Order of Priests.

The Bishop then gives a Bible to the newly ordained, saying,

Receive this Bible as a sign of the authority given you to preach the Word of God and to administer his Holy Sacraments. Do not forget the trust committed to you as a priest of the Church of God.

The Bishop greets the newly ordained Priest.

THE PEACE

The new Priest says to the Congregation,

Priest The Peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And also with you.

The People greet one another with a sign of God's peace.







The People remain standing or kneel as the Celebrant continues.


THE COMMUNION

Please join in singing the hymns during communion.




