

# **ABOUT THE ENSEMBLE**

**MISSION** 

Dedicated to enriching the Ocean State through the choral arts, by singing music from times ancient to modern, sacred to secular, all in celebration of the human voice.

Founded in 2016, Collegium Ancora is a professional chamber choir made up of talented singers from all over Rhode Island. The group serves as ensemble-in-residence at Grace Episcopal Church in Providence, rehearsing and performing in the splendid 170-year old building. Vince Edwards, our founding Artistic Director, wanted to build a group that was really indigenous to Rhode Island, celebrating the talent and musical ability that is so present in Providence and the greater Rhode Island community. The choir has approximately 40 members on the roster and between 18 and 24 singers will perform at any given concert. The name was chosen for a several reasons collegium, which means "a group whose members pursue shared goals"; and ancora which is Latin for hope and anchor, both present on the Rhode Island state seal.

Following our March 2024 performance of the Vaughan Williams Mass in G Minor, we return to the great English composer for our final concert of the season. Some of RVW's most beloved anthems will open the concert, followed by **Five Mystical Songs** featuring baritone Nicholas Halar and the Westminster Chamber Orchestra. The second half of the concert will feature numerous soloists from Collegium presenting **Songs of Travel** representing RVW's secular work

#### REPERTOIRE

While *Collegium Ancora* focuses on sacred *a cappella* (unaccompanied) music, the group sings quite a diverse repertoire, which is reflected in the schedule of performances each season.



Recent concerts have included G.F. Handel's oratorio Israel in Egypt, Henry Purcell's Te Deum and Jubilate, Antonio Vivaldi's Gloria, Choral Dances from Benjamin Britten's Gloriana, O schöne Nacht by Johannes Brahms, a varied concert featuring works of women composers from around the world, and David Conte's Elegy for Matthew Shepherd. In addition, Collegium participated in the commissioning and premiere of The Unarmed Child, a multimovement work by Micael Bussewitz-Quarm. A composition contest held in 2019 resulted in a new work by award-winning British composer Tamsin Jones, celebrating the LGBTQ+ community.
