
Observing All Saints Day

You are invited to "Sott' Acqua: A Tale of Two Cities Underwater" - this year's Splendor of Florence festival, to be held here November 9-17. The festival shares the story of life-changing floods that took place here in 1954 and in Florence just 12 years later, in 1966.



Join us here at Grace Church and select venues around Providence for a series of programs and events that highlight the floods that inundated both our own city and Florence, Italy in the mid-20th century. The festival also will share the resulting recognition of the fragility of the world around us, the power of community awareness, and the restoration of cultural treasures. Looking forward, visitors will see how both cities are confronting climate change through mitigation, protection, and preservation.

Organ Project Update - Making a Move!

Yesterday, another 53-ft trailer arrived from Canada – this time to LOAD most of our huge pipe organ and take it to the Casavant factory/shop in Quebec. On Wednesday of next week, a smaller truck will arrive to take the remainder of the organ. Then the scaffolding will come down, and the church returns to normal. And then we WAIT! And while we wait, we will be doing some important fundraising to help complete the project.

We have a number of tasks ahead of us to prepare for the August 2026 re-installation, but we will start on those in the new year. Thanks to everyone for their patience while we have undertaken perhaps the largest and most extensive organ refurbishment/renovation/expansion in Rhode Island's history!
