### Welcome, Dr. Barry Rose!

Barry Michael Rose OBE FRAM FRSCM HonFRCO, is a choir trainer and organist, best known for founding the choir and the pattern of daily sung worship at the new Guildford Cathedral in 1961, as well as directing the music at the 1981 wedding of Charles, Prince of Wales and Diana, Princess of Wales at St Paul's Cathedral in London. Dr. Rose was also the Director of Music at St. Alban's Abbey.

In 1996, he was invited to be the guest conductor for *Sing Praises: A Three Choirs Festival*, founded by John Abdenour, Brian Carson, and Vince Edwards. The festival has continued every year, save for 2021 due to Covid. The festival has included various choirs and their directors over the years, and St. Paul's, Fairfield, CT has been involved in every one of them. Grace's Director of Music, Vince Edwards, has participated in many of the festivals with four different choirs: St. Paul's, Fairfield; St. Bartholomew's, New York City; St. Paul's on the Green, Norwalk, CT; and finally, Grace Church in Providence.

The Grace Choristers and Choir were privileged to have Dr. Rose conduct their final Evensong at Salisbury Cathedral in the summer of 2023.


