### A Surprise Gift

This is the time of year when Episcopal churches prepare for the canonically-required "Annual Meeting of the Parish." As part of that preparation, parish leaders write reports to tell parishioners – and posterity – what the year just past was like for that particular church. As I cast my mind back to the year gone by, I read those various reports, and one of them mentioned a parishioner here at Grace that everyone who met her will never forget.



Mama Kelley (that may have been her given name) was a Liberian-American widow who lived at the

Cathedral Apartments just a stone's throw from the church. She was at every event and every service. Mama was at the church more than I was! She had a personality larger than life, and she often had wonderfully profound theological or biblical questions for me following a service or a Bible study. One of her most repeated instructions to me and others was that she did NOT want to be cremated.

When she died a few years ago, she had no family in this country that we knew of, but knowing that she wanted to be buried, we used one of the very few remaining open plots in our cemetery to lay her to rest. Parishioners and others from the community joined in the graveside ceremony that included prayers from the Prayer Book and hymns and songs of praise from both this country and her native land. It is still the only funeral/burial I have ever conducted at Grace Church Cemetery.

Grace Church paid the undertaker and other burial fees for Mama. We knew of no will or plans she might have made for her funeral service. We laid her to rest because we could and because Mama would have wanted it so. We had a reception in the Pavilion after the burial where people shared memories of Mama. There were so many, that the gathering lasted for hours.

Mama Kelley was a virtually-blind, elderly immigrant who lived alone in public housing who left us with wonderful memories of a unique human being. As it turns out, she also left us \$26,000.

We had no idea that Mama had done this until long after she had departed this life for the next. I would say that Mama Kelley was like the widow who put a penny into Temple treasury that Jesus commends for her generosity, but she left Grace a lot more than a penny! I count it as a blessing that I knew Mama Kelley and that she was proud to call Grace her home. So am I.

# Our Mural Restoration - More to See!

David Hughes and Vince Edwards met today with Gianfranco Pocobene, whose Boston-based firm is restoring the mural. Gianfranco showed them what processes are being used, and detailed that an earlier restoration included a fair amount of "over-painting" - where previous restorers painted damaged areas to match the dirty and varnished colors instead of matching the original colors.

The restoration team is working to remove as much of that over-painting as possible and, where it can't be removed, they will repaint - this time in the <u>original</u> color scheme. It's all very complex, but very exciting to see the colors and faces of the angels come to life!
