
Grace Church's Mural in the News!

It's official - the scaffolding is gone! The mural is now fully visible and looks so much better. You'll see Christ in Majesty, and all his angels, in their glory this Sunday. (The second photo shows the restored mural while the scaffolding still was being removed.)

In addition to the <u>broadcast on WPRI/Channel 12</u> mentioned in last week's enewsletter, the story of our mural restoration also was featured last Friday on <u>several newscasts on ABC6</u>, and was a <u>front-page story in Saturday's *Providence Journal*</u>. The ProJo article included some great photos - and it mentions times for our Open Doors ministry so hopefully more visitors will stop by to see the mural live!

On Sunday, June 1, we will rededicate the mural during our Sunday service when we celebrate Ascension Sunday. June 1 also will be our celebration of Grace Church Day, so save the date!

Note: The removal of the scaffolding also means we're back to our regular practices for liturgy and for serving Communion.

May Ray rest in peace and rise in glory.


Thursday Lenten Eucharist and **Supper - Starts Tonight**

You are invited to join us on Thursdays in Lent - tonight through April 10 - for a Lenten Eucharist and Supper. The Eucharist begins at 6pm in our Chapel of the Messiah, with a supper immediately following in The Pavilion.



Tonight's supper is provided by the 20s/30s+ Group (many thanks to them!); they invite you to bring salads and desserts to share.

Our supper next Thursday, March 20, will include delicious soups from <u>Blount Fine Foods</u>; please bring sweets, sides, and/or salads to share. Come for the Eucharist, the supper, or both. All are welcome!



Brown University Chorus Performs "Israel Into Egypt" -Sunday

In his 33rd and final year directing the Brown University Chorus, <u>Frederick Jodry</u> leads the Chorus and the Providence Baroque Orchestra in a performance of Handel's oratorio <u>Israel in Egypt</u> at Grace Church.

The concert takes place this Sunday, March 16, at 4pm. Tickets are \$25; students are \$5. Note that there won't be cash sales at the door; <u>click here to purchase tickets</u> <u>online</u>. (Purchasing tickets in advance is strongly recommended.)

Lent at Grace Church

There are several opportunities to worship here at Grace throughout Lent:

- Friday: Each week, join us at noon for the short liturgy of **The Way of the Cross (also called "Stations of the Cross")**. During this lunchtime service, participants walk to 14 stations posted throughout the church commemorating Christ's journey to Mount Calvary and his death on the Cross. - <u>Sunday</u>: As usual, we'll gather at 10am each Sunday morning to celebrate **Holy Eucharist, with our Choir** singing seasonal anthems and psalms.
- Thursday evenings: Starting at 6pm, join us for a brief service of Holy Eucharist, followed by a supper in The Pavilion. Each week's menu will vary, based on who volunteers to bring it that evening. (We also have a supply of delicious soups donated by Blount Fine Foods to help with the meal.)

In addition, our Choir and Music department will present several programs throughout the Lenten season:

- Third Thursdays at Noon: provides diverse programs of music free of charge for the enjoyment of the community and visitors to the city.
 - March 20 "Seraphim and Cherubim" featuring Collegium Ancora singers Soprano Jess Huetteman and Tenor Brad Kleyla.
 - April 17 Brown University Chamber Ensemble featuring students participating in Chamber Music Ensembles in the Music Department at Brown University.
- Sunday, March 23: Choral Evensong Music of Wood, Spicer, Knight, Dyson and featuring Gerald Finzi's masterpiece Lo, the full, final sacrifice sung by the Choir & Choristers of Grace Church. A reception follows in The Pavilion. Doors open at 3:30pm.

Jess is a graduate of the University of Massachusetts, Amherst, and Westminster Choir College. She currently teaches at the Rhode Island Philharmonic School of Music.

Brad is a graduate of Chicago's DePaul University where he studied Sound Engineering.



In addition to being an accomplished tenor, Brad is equally at home on the trombone.

Jess and Brad are staff singers at Grace Church, and both are members of Collegium Ancora and Ensemble Altera. Cheryl Bishkoff, Principal Oboe of the Rhode Island Philharmonic, will be a special guest on the concert.
