## Visit from Bishop Mark Edington - Sunday!

This Sunday, May 11, Grace Church is thrilled to welcome to our pulpit The Rt. Rev. Mark D.W. Edington - Bishop in Charge of the Convocation of Episcopal Churches in Europe.

Bishop Mark came to this post in 2019 after serving in the Diocese of Massachusetts where he was rector of Saint John's Episcopal Church in Newtonville, Massachusetts, and



director of the Amherst College Press. His consecration as Bishop took place on April 6, 2018 at the American Cathedral of the Holy Trinity in Paris, France - where our own rector, Jonathan Huyck, served as Canon Pastor for several years and where he is an honorary canon!

Ordained to the priesthood in 2001, Bishop Mark served as the first Epps Fellow and Chaplain to Harvard College in The Memorial Church of Harvard University.

Bishop Mark writes frequently on issues at the intersection of public policy and religion. His essays have appeared in The Atlantic Monthly, the New York Times, the Christian Science Monitor, and other national publications. He has blogged on The Huffington Post and on WBUR's Cognoscenti, and is a frequent commentator on New England Public Radio. He is a life member of the Council on Foreign Relations, where he is active in the Religion and Foreign Policy program.

Bishop Mark is a graduate of Albion College, where he received the A.B. in philosophy and political science summa cum laude, and was inducted into Phi Beta Kappa; the Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy; and Harvard Divinity School. He has studied in programs focused on European integration at the Université libre de Bruxelles, and on post-Cold War European security at Christian-Albrechts-Universität. He is married to Judith, a graduate of Albion College, Boston College, and Harvard Law School, who is Counsel in the Tax Department of Sullivan and Worcester, Boston.



# Third Thursday: The Path Project -May 15

Our "Third Thursdays at Noon" series continues on Thursday, May 15, with a unique multilingual performance.

**The Path Project**, artistically curated by Eliana Barwinski and Mahima Kumara, aims to unite individuals through the

intersection of music, spirituality, and pilgrimage. This year-long project begins with rehearsals of Joby Talbot's acclaimed work, "Path of Miracles," and culminates in a 240-km pilgrimage along the Camino de Santiago, concluding with a performance in Santiago de Compostela, Spain.

This sacred journey challenges participants to seek inner strength and endurance, guided by Saint James, the patron saint of pilgrims. As the project progresses, it fosters a sense of community through shared experiences.

The music of "Path of Miracles" highlights five key landmarks along the Camino: Roncesvalles, Burgos, León, Santiago de Compostela, and Finisterre, the latter symbolizing 'the end of the world.' Performed in over seven religious languages, this cinematic piece transports audiences, inviting them to walk alongside us on this profound spiritual and musical journey.

The performance is free and open to all. As is always the case for weekday events, parking in our lot is very limited, so please plan ahead and be prepared for street parking.

## **Choral Compline - May 18**

The beautiful service of Compline will be held next Sunday, May 18, at 8pm. Doors open at 7:30pm, and parking is available in our lot. This mesmerizing service lasts less than half an hour, and features Gregorian chant, hundreds of candles, and fragrant incense.

## **Grace Church Day - June 1**

On Sunday, June 1, we will celebrate the Feast of the Ascension; Ascension Day is 40 days after Christ's resurrection which is May 30 this year.

A church's "feast of title" can be transferred to the nearest



Sunday. Churches named "Grace" don't technically have a "feast of title" but historically we have adopted Ascension Day as ours. Our precedent for this practice dates to May 1, 1913, the first Ascension Day with the newly added Chancel designed by Ralph Adams Cram. From *A History of Grace Church:* 

"Ascension Day, May 1, saw the active operation of a plan dear to [the rector] Dr. Crowder's heart, namely the observance of that festival as 'Grace Church Day,' comparable to Trinity Sunday or the appropriate Saints' Day for a Church bearing the name of the Trinity or of some saint."

This day is all the more appropriate as the great Triptych above the High Altar is, indeed, a depiction of the Ascension of Christ. Additionally, a panel in the great chancel window above the High Altar and Triptych includes a traditional Ascension image: the feet of Christ just disappearing into the sky above as St. Mary and the Apostles look upwards.

In 2025, we will add to that celebration a re-dedication of our newly restored Chancel Arch mural which depicts Christ in Majesty. Following the service, all are invited to join us for a potluck luncheon in the Pavilion. Please add your name to the sign-up sheets in the Pavilion during coffee hour!

Note that the final day for Sunday School is Sunday, June 15.


#### Youth Group
