The Rhode Island Civic Chorale and Orchestra kicks off their 2025-26 season here at Grace Church tomorrow (November 8) at 7pm. This opening concert is filled with the brilliance of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart, pairing the radiant serenity of the Vesperae solennes de confessore – a work filled with grace, devotion, and sparkling choral writing – with the profound emotional power of the Requiem, his final, unfinished masterpiece, shrouded in mystery and reverence.

From the quiet hush of evening prayer to the emotional charge of the famous Lacrimosa, this concert invites you on a journey through light and shadow, reflection and transcendence.

We appreciate your patience during this time.



Seeking Food Donations to Supplement Reduced SNAP Benefits

First, many thanks to all who brought donations on All Saints' Sunday for our friends served by Pete & Andy's Food Pantry. In addition to the food shown here, we also received \$650 worth of Walmart gift cards - extraordinary! Your gifts surpassed all expectations and will provide



an important source of support for our neighbors.

While we are gratified by the news this week that emergency SNAP funds are being released, those funds allow only 50% of the benefits each family receives, and only for one month. So, the problem continues...and we still need your help.

Please bring your contributions of food and gift cards this Sunday, and for as long as the federal shutdown lasts.

Purchase some extra dry goods at the store and dig through your pantry to see what you can spare, and bring those items to church on Sunday. (Due to the chance for breakage, glass containers are not

preferred.) All donations will be turned over to Pete & Andy's Food Pantry for them to share with our friends and neighbors in Providence.

And if you'd like to donate a gift card or two, Rev. Maryalyce Sullivan at Sts.
Peter and Andrew advises that cards for Walmart or Price Rite - both of which
are in their neighborhood - are very helpful! (Please put gift-card donations in an
envelope with your name on it if you'd like that donation reflected on your
giving statement.)

More About the Shutdown and SNAP:


According to this article from WJAR, 140,000 vulnerable Rhode Island residents - some of whom are in church with us each Sunday - rely on SNAP benefits to cover some of their food costs. The program disburses approximately \$30M each month in the Ocean State and, for some families, is a significant part of their monthly food budget.

The State is working to find ways to help, but their resources are limited: When asked how long the state could front or supplement that funding, [RI House Speaker Joe] Shekarchi said, "Not long at all. It's weeks, it's not months."

Shawl Ministry at Grace


