A Loss to Our Grace Church Family

We were saddened to learn of the death of A.T. Wall on Thursday, who - along with his family - has had a long association



with Grace Church. During his lifetime, A.T. served the Rhode Island community in many ways, most notably as the State Director of Corrections for almost 20 years.

A.T.'s sister is Grace Church member Polly Wall. His widow, the Very Rev'd. Maria DeCarvalho, is an Episcopal priest who was ordained at Grace and has served in a number of leadership and spiritual roles in Rhode Island.

A memorial service will be held for A.T. at 11am on Tuesday, December 16, here at Grace Church. All are invited to attend.

Decking Our Halls for Christmas



Stewardship 2026 -Where We Stand So Far

Many thanks to the 92 parish families who already have expressed their financial support for the mission and ministries of Grace Church for the coming year. We appreciate your generosity!



We're deep in the middle of developing our 2026 budget and, as you can imagine, pledge commitments form a significant portion of the income we use to plan for the new year. As of December 11, we've received pledge commitments of \$316,791.52 toward our goal of \$400,000; this total is a bit short of where we were by this time last year. In real terms, it means we don't yet have enough income to cover the programs and events we had **this year**, let alone add/expand more for next year.

Typically, we have most pledges confirmed by the third week in December, so this is the week to add your pledge toward our goal!

That difference of \$85,000 sounds like a lot to make up, but the great news is that if everyone who hasn't yet made their pledge for 2026 just renewed for the same amount as 2025, we'd raise another \$85,154.92 - meeting our goal! And if pledges were just 10% higher, we could have another \$40,000 to put on more musical events, offer more Youth-Group activities and trips, build a feeding ministry or more outreach opportunities, and support more local nonprofit partners.

We know you believe in the work of Grace Church. Will you support it and the many programs you enjoy here? Be sure to submit your pledge today!




arrange a pickup.)

Beginnings and Endings - A Book for Advent

Dear friends at Grace,





Endings (and what happens in between" is a book of short daily readings, one for each day from the 1st of December through to Epiphany. It is arranged around the tradition of lighting candles each Sunday on the Advent Wreath, with each candle representing a particular step through the story of salvation. It starts with the journey made by Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and their families to find a place - a promised land - where they could live under God's reign, to the prophets' longings for a time in the future when God's promises would be fulfilled, to John the Baptist's announcement that the place is here, and the time is now - Christ is among us. But finally, all these longings for God make sense as Mary (who is always celebrated on the fourth Sunday of Advent) shows us at last that the fulfillment of the promise is Christ within us.

If you would like to join me on this Advent journey, read along day by day in the book - and there will be supplementary articles on my substack throughout Advent.
